The aim of this all-day hands-on session is to help teachers make the most of Adobe Creative Cloud and associated Adobe software in the learning and teaching process with a focus on enhancing 21st century digital literacy, communication and creativity skills in alignment with the Victorian & Australian Curriculum.

No previous experience with Adobe software is required and resources will be provided for both new and experienced Adobe users. This event will be facilitated by Dr Tim Kitchen, Adobe's Senior Education Specialist for Asia Pacific and will aim to cover a mix of the following resources and educational concepts:

- Photoshop tips & tricks for teachers
- Working with the free Adobe Spark creativity tools
- Multimodal Text with Adobe Muse & Adobe Spark
- Flipped Learning with Adobe Presenter, Adobe Spark & Premiere Clip
- Basic Video production with Adobe Premiere Clip & Premiere Pro
- PDF & document management with Adobe Acrobat
- Simple animation in the classroom with Adobe Character Animator
- Classroom resources on the Adobe Education Exchange
- New research in teaching Gen Z students.
